With the year now started, rather than look backwards, or to focus on what appears to be doom and gloom in terms of the wider market and economy, we want to look forwards and we feel a sense of optimism for the year ahead, with some of the global challenges of 2021 and 2022 now behind us and a new focus to press on and move forwards.

We are really close now to opening our latest service, "Dickenson Road". It's been a real journey through lockdown to achieve this project, but as it starts to be furnished, we feel really optimistic that it will be a great home. It has been adopted by Greater Manchester as their next service. This will mean that a number of individuals stuck in hospital, will be able finally step down in to the community and restart their lives. It is designed as 4 apartments within an overall home with the ability to help individuals who cannot share spaces easily to have a place where they can have a greater level of control of their space and to retract to, when they really need to. With the building operating as a single home, we hope the tenants will also all benefit from opportunities to grow their world and to socialise together. It's a far cry from the isolated single apartment in the community we have seen commissioned more recently in the sector and in many cases, their current hospital setting.

In December we reviewed our employee remuneration for all support workers, both against the market and also against the competing pressures of wider industries. Whilst we felt we remained competitive in the market overall, we also then took a further step to look at the challenges faced by our employees, in a world where inflation has had a material impact on the cost of living, and rents have been increasing at an unprecedented rate. Whilst the local authority and ICB processes will not finalise their uplift processes until April, we felt that waiting for their responses would be the wrong decision and that we needed to act now to support our workforce. The rate changes for 2023 are significant, the largest in our history and go beyond the proposals suggested by the living wage foundation. They represent our ambition to support our workforce, to keep our workforce, so we have consistency of support for the Zeno family, equally we want to reach out and attract talented individuals working in healthcare across the Greater Manchester area as we continue to work together to deliver the best possible care for our supported people.

We hope you all feel the same level of optimism that we do, and whilst 2023 will not be without its challenges, as a team and a family we feel we are well placed for this year to be a great year for everyone.

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### **Registered Manager's Corner Feb 2023**

#### I hope you all had a great festive period and New Year.

Resolutions are the common theme for most of us at this time of year, as we are full of hope and expectation of the coming year, and I am sure you are all the same as me in making several resolutions for 2023. Unfortunately, these resolutions can sometimes only last a few weeks, but I am determined that 2023 will be a brighter and more engaging year than 2022, which I am glad to see the back of.

The year of 2022 will always be identified within healthcare as the year that the government attempted to mandate vaccinations for all healthcare workers and then swiftly removed this mandate, and all restrictions and lockdowns ended. It also ended with a cost-of-living crisis, that continues, high fuel costs, inflation topping 11%, and we saw interest rates start to rise for the first time in over a decade.

Regardless, we are determined that we can now start to get back onto the development path we were on before March 2020, which will start with the reintroduction of the cultural reviews, annual open days in May and family days in September. These latter events have been missed by all of us, as they have always provided an opportunity for families, Support Workers, Managers, and the people we support to come together safely and enjoy each other's company.

Growing the organisation over the next 12 months is vital to ensure that we provide employment opportunities for those people who are ambitious to develop within their career. With this in mind, we have already increased Support Workers and Managers hourly rates in January to ensure that we are rewarding our fantastic teams, as well as demonstrating our continued investment and loyalty. This will ensure that we are more than competitive within the healthcare industry to attract new and experienced candidates and allow us to recruit for gaps in staff teams.

Service growth will come from filling our current voids across our nineteen services, as well as opening new services, including Dickenson Road.

With this desired growth, we have had to make changes to the management team to ensure that we grow safely and professionally. I have been the only Registered Manager of the supported services for several years now and I have taken the decision to promote Liz Done, James Brown and Darren Watmough to the position of Registered Manager with the CQC.

Liz, James, and Darren will be accountable for managing several services each, which I have already communicated to everyone, and they will have their own Deputies to support them. We have promoted Cat Germaney, Paul Steel-Smith, and Paul Edwards to the Deputy Registered Managers team, who will join the current DRM's, Matt Bryan, and Andrew Bardsley.

The change to the RM team will allow greater accountability for each RM and allow me to visit services more periodically to meet staff and supported people and to ensure that the ethos and values of ZENO are maintained. For clarity, I will still be around and will manage and support the new Registered Managers to ensure that our lofty standards continue.

Andrew Bardsley, who has been a manager for ZENO for many years is due to retire in April 2023, which will be a sad loss to the ZENO family, his services, teams, families, and the people he supports. However, I have been able to persuade him to return in the summer in another role, supporting the auditing process and engaging with services and staff, so this will provide another layer of reassurance and accountability to our services.

Helen Troup, the ASDAN Co-ordinator will also be retiring in March 2023, which will be a major change for the ASDAN programme and a personal loss for me. Helen and I go back almost a guarter of a century when we both worked as Support Workers and she was my first recruit when we started ZENO. Helen was the Registered Manager for over a decade and supported me and Andy to grow the business and develop a culture of transparency, robustness and dedication. More recently, Helen has supported us to plan, design and manage the ASDAN centre, which has massively improved the lives of our Supported People. I will always be in her debt for the courage and support she showed me during various challenging periods in the early and later years. We all wish Helen well with her new adventures.

Please let me take this opportunity to wish every one of you a fantastic new year, I look forward to seeing more of you over the next 12 months.

Laura has been continuing with her computer skills, this can be seen by her typing out work from a word sheet and sending emails to me, thanks Laura for reminding me when you are at college!!










# **HILLCREST**







They have been taking part in cooking activities with their staff team and sharing a class with another service user at ASDAN where they interact and create art to display in service.



#### **Safety Interventions** Training

Over the past year we have been moving from the training that was known as Management Actual & Potential Physical Aggression (MAPPA) and we are now solely training Safety Interventions Training.

You will have noticed that the delivery format has changed with the theory now predominantly being delivered online and face to face now becoming shorter bespoke sessions.

The face-to-face training runs as a three hour training session with the morning session starting at 9am, finishing at 12pm and the afternoon session starting at 1pm, finishing at 4pm.

Restraint Reduction Network

#### **Restraint Reduction** Network

The Restraint Reduction Network has a set of ethical training standards that protect and support human rights and support the minimisation of restrictive practices.

The standards have a strong focus on the best interest of the individuals supported by the staff and therapeutic approaches to supporting people when they are distressed.

The standard focus on improving the quality of life of those being restrained and the staff / others supporting them. it has a Strong PBS focus and reduces reliance on restrictive practices by promoting positive culture and practice that focuses on prevention, de-escalation and reflective practice. Increase understanding of the root causes of behaviour and recognition that many behaviours are the result of distress due to unmet needs.
